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Apple Devices

Apple uses a feature in IOS called, “Screen Time”. With this feature parents can;

- Restrict inappropriate content, downloads or purchases.
- Set downtime for their children’s exposure to apps.
- Restrict usage of communication apps. E.g. Facetime

Android Devices

Android uses an application called, “Family Link”. With this app, parents can;

- Set downtime for their children’s devices and time limit for apps.
- Secure their children’s accounts (passwords, account info).
- Set and manage permissions of apps on their children’s device.
- Locate their children’s device on a map or set a Geo-fence.

Windows Devices

Microsoft uses a feature called, “Microsoft Family Services”. With this feature, parents can;

- Set screen time limits and prompt Screen time requests
- Device, App and Game limits (Windows, Xbox, Android)
- App, game and internet filters and activity summaries
- Location sharing and Saved places
