POLICE HELICOPTER PILOT

The post holder must be an experienced helicopter pilot utilizing the H145 (BK117 D2 series) Helicopter for the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS) to provide an airborne response in the performance of law enforcement, HEMS, rapid transportation, and other police operations. The post holder will perform a comprehensive range of assignments in a full-functioning capacity, available for duty 24 hours a day, under the direction of the Unit Commanding Officer.

Knowledge, Experience & Skills:

The successful candidate **must** possess:

- i. Current Commercial Pilot License to operate Airbus H145 (BK117 D2) Helicopter, with medical certificate (class 1 or equivalent);
- ii. Minimum of 3000 hours helicopter flight time, of which 1500 hours should have been pilot in command, with a minimum of 200 hours night flying experience;
- iii. Minimum of 1000 hours of multi-engine turbine flying;
- iv. Experience in flying over water during day and night missions;
- v. Excellent written and verbal English communications skills;
- vi. Excellent administrative skills in maintaining and organising records, logbooks, and other documentation relating to police flight operations and missions;
- vii. Previous experience in Police, HEMS, SAR, or Military role, with overwater operations; and
- viii. Night Vision Imaging Systems (NVIS) 20 hours experience minimum.

Desired experience includes:

- i. An alternative to H145, pilots demonstrating a high level of experience on the Airbus H(EC)135 or EC145 (BK117 C2) may be considered for conversion training.
